The John Simmons Cup

This is a new annual competition in memory of the late John Simmons, who was the Secretary of the East Hertfordshire Bowling Association for **31** years. This is a singles competition and the final will be played on the Association's Finals Day.

Started in 2022 season

1. This is a 4 woods singles game.
2. Toss a coin at the start of the game to decide who starts the first set. The second set will be started by the other bowler. The start of the 3rd set will be decided on a toss of a coin again. If there is a 'tie break' end, the start of that end is also decided by tossing a coin.
3. At the start of the game both players have 2 practice ends, a choice of 2, 3 or 4 woods. (if you cannot agree it will be 4 woods)
4. The game consists of three sets of 7 ends.
5. The winner of each set receives 2 points.
6. If a set is tied both bowlers receive 1 point.
7. The winner is the bowler who scores 4 points.
8. If a bowler wins the first 2 sets the game is over.
9. Should both bowlers accumulate 3 points each after the 3 sets are bowled, a one end 'tie break' will be played.
